

MARK SANDERSON: Did you attend any other briefings or debriefs following that?

TERENCE ADDIS: Yes! Yes, I attended a briefing at 3.30pm on Monday, 17 April 1989. I don't remember the location of this meeting but I'm sure that the contents of this briefing are a matter of record for your department.

MARK SANDERSON: Yes.

TERENCE ADDIS: And I think the only comment I made was, "I think you've said it all".

MARK SANDERSON: Yes. Again I'll ask the question, Terry, was anything else discussed that wasn't on record?

TERENCE ADDIS: Not to my knowledge, no. Not to my knowledge. There's the press statement. You'll have got that I'm sure.

MARK SANDERSON: Moving on to recording of -- or how officers recorded recollections of the events that took place.

TERENCE ADDIS: Well I can't speak for any other officer in regard to that question but I'm aware that at one of these briefings one of the senior officers stated that there should be no pocket book entries at this stage. I don't recollect just what the reason was for. But I seem to recollect that my statement of my involvement, after the incident at Hillsborough, was made, I believe, on 20 April. Yes.

MARK SANDERSON: Can you remember which officer made the --

TERENCE ADDIS: I'm aware that you've got a statement -- you shown me a statement of mine with the date on, 29th. I'm not aware of how that's got on.

MARK SANDERSON: I think that's how they -- that could be the date it was inputted in to the system.

TERENCE ADDIS: When it was inputted. Yes.

MARK SANDERSON: They didn't give us the date of that. Can you remember which senior officer made the decision about the reports?

TERENCE ADDIS: I won't say while the tape's on! Now, wait a minute, that's not it. There's only one there. You must give me time, Mr Sanderson, because I'm having to read through the briefing notes.

HEATHER BECK: May have a post it, if you want

TERENCE ADDIS: I'm trying to save myself reading through the complete briefing notes actually. You don't know?

HEATHER BECK: You're wanting the document that shows where ...?

TERENCE ADDIS: Don't make your pocket books up, yes.

HEATHER BECK: If you want to have a look at the notes of the 17th.

TERENCE ADDIS: Thank you. I've got two here.

HEATHER BECK: It's actually in a couple of documents where it's mentioned.

TERENCE ADDIS: That's it. That's the 17th as well.

HEATHER BECK: Do you want me to take you to the page?

TERENCE ADDIS: Yes. Please. Save us all a lot of time. I usually speak up for myself, instead of writing notes, but when you've got a tape on it's difficult.

TARA INGHAM: You said that you're unsure of who it is that gave you that --

TERENCE ADDIS: Sorry? Oh yes, I can't remember who it was.

TARA INGHAM: You can't remember.

TERENCE ADDIS: One of the senior officers. Senior to me. It was said. That's why I didn't do mine until the 20th, if I think about it. One slots in to the other.

TARA INGHAM: Right.

HEATHER BECK: Now that is a meeting on 17th at 3.30pm where you come in later. I think that meeting's held. I'll just have a quick look. That's the one where you can't remember where it's held, isn't it. But, yes, if you just look at that page there, that's where it mentions about statements.

TERENCE ADDIS: This doesn't say anything about pocket books does it.

HEATHER BECK: Let me have a look. It's on the other page.

TERENCE ADDIS: Oh right.

HEATHER BECK: It might not do actually. It might just start talking about how the accounts are going to be made.
